Karla Lopez is a Staff Attorney at the Legal Action Center, a non-profit law and policy organization that fights discrimination against people with addiction, HIV/AIDS, and criminal records. At the Legal Action Center, Karla represents clients facing such discrimination, as well as clients whose HIV confidentiality has been breached. Karla also counsels and trains health and social services providers, as well as state and federal governments, on their obligations under anti-discrimination and privacy laws. Karla participated in writing and editing the 2012 edition of LAC's seminal book on the law governing the privacy of alcohol and drug treatment information, *Confidentiality and Communication: A Guide to the Federal Alcohol and Drug Confidentiality Law and HIPAA*. Karla has also conducted trainings on behalf of the U.S. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration about the confidentiality of alcohol and drug treatment records, with a focus on special issues arising in the context of electronic health records and integrated care, and has conducted trainings around the country about the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008. Prior to joining the Legal Action Center, Karla worked on criminal justice reform at the Open Society Institute and Policy Center. Karla received her B.A. from Bard College and her J.D. Georgetown University Law Center, where she was a Public Interest Law Scholar.
